

GRE/MAT WAIVER REQUEST FORM

Prospective students for the Meredith College Master of Arts in Teaching or Master of Education programs may request a GRE or Miller’s Analogy Test (MAT) waiver. Without an approved waiver, all applicants are required to submit official scores as follows:

- Master of Arts in Teaching GRE
- Master of Education GRE or MAT

To apply for a waiver, please submit the following via email to gradeducation@meredith.edu

- Completed waiver request form
- Undergraduate transcripts (required) and graduate transcripts (if applicable; unofficial copies acceptable)
- Current resume
- Copy of National Board Certification (if applicable)

Submitting an application does NOT guarantee a waiver approval. Waiver applicants will receive results by email within approximately two weeks. An approved GRE/MAT waiver is valid for one year.

- _____ Combined undergraduate GPA of 3.75 or higher¹

 - 2 courses or at least 6 credits of mathematics +
 - 2 courses or at least 6 credits of English (writing and/or literature) +
 - 2 courses or at least 6 credits of science +
 - 2 courses or at least 6 credits of history, geography, political science, economics or anthropology

- _____ Six or more graduate credit hours in the past 10 years with a 4.0 cumulative GPA¹

- _____ Established success at Meredith College as defined by a grade of at least 85 in one graduate-level, post-baccalaureate study (PBS) course and a letter from the instructor of a second, in-progress course indicating that an overall grade of 85 or higher in the course is expected.

¹In order to be considered, credit hours, GPA's, and degrees must be from regionally-accredited colleges or universities. Waiver applicants with courses and/or degrees under consideration from outside the U.S. must submit course-by-course transcript evaluations for undergraduate and/or graduate courses and/or degrees. Applicants should refer to the current [Graduate School Catalogue](http://www.meredith.edu/on_campus_services/academic_and_support_services/registrar) (http://www.meredith.edu/on_campus_services/academic_and_support_services/registrar) to identify approved evaluation services. To be considered for a waiver, undergraduate and/or graduate degrees must be U.S. equivalents.
