# Ellen Brewer Infant and Toddler Lab Home

Welcome to the Ellen Brewer House (EBH), an infant-toddler early education program that is part of the Child Development Program here at Meredith College. EBH is licensed by the North Carolina Department of Child Development and Early Education (DCDEE) as a five-star center, serving children whose ages may range from six weeks to two years. The program is available to families in the Meredith community and the Wake County community-at-large. The environment is designed to provide a safe, secure, respectful and nurturing setting in which children can learn about themselves, each other, and the world around them. The curriculum is based on the developmental needs of the children, and is designed to foster development and learning in all domains: physical, social, emotional, intellectual, and language. It incorporates the state-approved curriculum for infants and toddlers, Creative Curriculum, as well as components of Conscious Discipline and the Montessori approach. Observation based planning is the basis for the implementation of the curriculum.

The program is based on well-established principles of child development. Research has clearly demonstrated the importance of early experience in the development of children. We believe it is particularly important to create an environment where children can develop self-regulatory skills and a positive sense of self. Self-esteem grows when we celebrate the individual child and allow all children to develop at their own pace. We are committed to the ideas that every young child learns through sensorimotor experience, that play is an integral part of learning (and our curriculum), and that families are the center of a child's world.

In order to provide an environment that best meets the needs of the children; we believe it is important to create a partnership with our families. All of our policies and procedures are created to foster such a relationship—extending to the parent various opportunities to participate in EBH as we work together to create a program that promotes the development of the whole child. Families are the experts on their children!

We look forward to being a partner with you and we thank you for trusting us with your most precious possession, your child.
