Eligibility

First-year students are not eligible to study abroad until the summer after their first year at Meredith. This program is open to members of the Classes of 2026, 2025, and 2024.

Course

ENG 349: Shakespeare and Race (3 credits, requires Spring 2024 course registration)

Fulfills Global Perspectives, Literature, and Writing Intensive requirements.

This course examines multiple Shakespeare plays in historical context with attention to their modern resonances. Supplementary readings will include critical and literary responses to Shakespeare's work. Contextual research and discussion will include gender, sexuality, race, or class. Pre-requisite: ENG 200.

Program Overview

Did you know that 15 of Shakespeare's plays take place in Italy? There is no better way to connect with his works than to experience first-hand the global contexts where they are set!

During the Spring semester, we will study five of Shakespeare's plays and a variety of non-fiction approaches to interracial relations in Shakespeare's work and in our current times. We will also learn about understanding cultures, including our own.

We will meet on a regular basis before Spring Break. The schedule of classes will be created on the availability of the students accepted. The program will add 3 credits to your Spring 2024 course load.

During Spring Break, we will travel to central and northern Italy to visit the settings of the plays we are reading in class. We will start our adventure in Meredith's home away from home, Sansepolcro, where you will be oriented to Italy and Italian culture, and learn about other great creators that proceeded Shakespeare's life. We will also learn from local experts about the current political realities in Italy that relate to themes we discuss with the plays. From Sansepolcro, we will travel to Venice for a multi-day excursion. A short train from Venice will take us to Verona where we will tour Juliet's house (from Romeo and Juliet!) and explore palaces and towers built in Shakespeare's time. We will also venture to Florence for an overnight excursion.

There will be three meetings when we return, where you will reflect on what you have learned from our travels and present your final projects.

Cost

\$2,500 includes:

- \$100 non-refundable application deposit
- Accommodations in Italy
- Weekday breakfasts and lunches
- Academic excursions to Venice, Verona, Anghiari, and Florence
- Coach transport to Sansepolcro
- On-site support from Meredith faculty
- Pre-departure orientation and resources
