Important Reminders about Financial Aid (Please Read!)

- Students should research the costs associated with their selected study abroad program and develop a funding plan to cover these costs. If the student is seeking financial support from family or outside sources, they should discuss program expenses with these parties.
- In order to receive any funding to study abroad, students must be in good financial and academic standing with the College.
- For semester-long study abroad programs, students must return to Meredith and complete at least one semester of coursework after the program abroad. If the student does not return to Meredith, they will be charged a fee equivalent to the amount of all institutional aid used to fund the study abroad program abroad.
- If a student receives any institutional funding to study abroad for one summer or semester term, they will not receive any institutional funding for a future summer or semester program abroad. This is not applicable to competitive scholarships offered by the Office of International Programs.
- Teaching Scholar, Presidential, or Legacy Scholar institutional aid may only be used on a student's <u>first</u> study abroad experience. For Teaching Scholars, a second study abroad may only occur during the summer term.
- In order to receive financial assistance for a summer program, students must earn at least six credit hours during the summer.
- If students do not pay in full by the deadline listed on their acceptance letter from the Office of International Programs or Meredith Affiliate provider, they will not be eligible to participate and will be subject to refund/withdrawal policies of the program.
- Financial assistance may be affected if students do not complete their program or earn the minimum credit hours required.
- When financial aid is disbursed, it is the student's responsibility to pick up the check from the Meredith
 Office of Accounting. If they would like their check to be mailed, the student must notify the Office of
 Accounting and provide a current mailing address. Funds are typically released 10 to 14 days ahead of
 departure date.
