# **PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS**

#### TRADITIONAL PRIVATE LESSONS

**Description:** We welcome students of all ages and backgrounds. Students may register for 30-, 45-, 60-, or 90-minute lessons, taught by Meredith faculty members. In a 16-week semester, students receive a minimum of twelve private lessons with their instructor. The remaining four sessions may be private, partner, or group instruction.

**Lessons offered**: piano, voice-beginning age 13, violin, viola, cello, guitar, flute, organ, music theory and composition. As well as bassoon, horn, and percussion.

**Description:** Private and small group lessons are offered in Suzuki violin or viola to students from age three and up. Lessons reflect the philosophy of Dr. Suzuki who believed that all children could become fine musicians. Parent participation is expected. Lessons include 15-, 30-, 45-, or 60-minute private and small group lessons, concerts, and recitals.

# INTERMEDIATE STRINGS ORCHESTRA (Triangle String Orchestra)

Fee: \$235.00

**Description:** This class will serve the student who has had some prior instruction in playing the violin, viola, cello or bass (suggested minimum of three years) and is able to perform Grade 2/3 level literature. Previous ensemble experience is helpful but not required. Areas of focus will include study of standard literature at the Grade 2/3 level with emphasis on playing in tune, group bowing techniques for string players, balance, blend, and ensemble playing techniques. The choirs frequently perform around the Triangle, as well as at various national and international choral festivals. CCGC commits to teaching choristers not only how to sing, but also about the fundamentals of music theory and composition to set them up for success as amateur or professional musicians in the future.

**Description:** The Meredith College Ringers, hand bell ensemble, is returning for the 2023-2024 academic year. This group will be led by the Director of the Raleigh Ringers and is open to anyone interested age 13 and up who are able to read music on a basic level. The group will be limited to 15 members.

The course will be offered to college students as a for credit class and to community members through CSOM. Community members use the online CSOM registration form to sign up for this course.

#### MEREDITH COLLEGE COMMUNITY MIXED CHOIR

Fee: \$150 per semester. Must register and pay in full each semester.

**Description:** This 2-hour class will meet weekly for 14 weeks each semester. Open to Any member of the Triangle community who has gone through their voice change. Prior training is not required The Meredith College Community Chorus is a non-auditioned choral ensemble that sings quality literature comprised of known classics, overlooked masterpieces, and works by contemporary composers. Rehearsals encourage a well-rounded musician, with a focus on healthy vocal technique, strong aural skills, musical and text analysis, understanding of historical or contemporary context, and performing skills.

Meredith College Community Chorus includes:

One concert a semester

Optional 15-minute sight-reading/theory class every week pre-rehearsal

14-week semester

2-hour long rehearsal from 2-4 PM on Sundays

# **TUITION AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

#### **Traditional Lessons**

- b) 30-minute lesson tuition: \$1,136.00, (\$284.00 per payment)
- c) 45-minute lesson tuition: \$1,704.00, (\$426.00 per payment)
- d) 60-minute lesson tuition: \$2,272.00, (\$568.00 per payment)
- e) 90-minute lesson tuition: \$3,408.00, (\$852.00 per payment)

#### Suzuki Lessons (violin, viola, cello)

See tuition fees for Suzuki lessons below. Four payments per year (25% due at registration, 25% October 1<sup>st</sup>, 25% January 1<sup>st</sup>, 25% March 1<sup>st</sup>).

- a) 15-minute lesson tuition: \$734.00, (\$183.50 per payment)
- b) 30-minute lesson tuition: \$1,302.00, (\$325.50 per payment)
- c) 45-minute lesson tuition: \$1,870.00, (\$467.50 per payment)
- d) 60-minute lesson tuition: \$2,438.00, (\$609.50 per payment)

### **Group Classes**

Student's register each semester for group classes. Full tuition for group classes is due at the time of registration.

Intermediate Strings Orchestra (Formerly Beginning Orchestra): \$235.00 per semester.
7 PM to 9 PM on Wednesdays. *Students must register each semester.*Meredith College Community Choir: \$150.00 per semester. *Day and time to be determined.* 14 weeks per semester. Students must register each semester.

#### **BILLING & PAYMENT OPTIONS**

Both returning and new students must make initial payment by check, cashier's check, or money order. Meredith Accounting will provide a link to pay online that will allow credit cards for payments. You will receive a paper bill from the Meredith Accounting Department, by mail three times during the school year. Your deposit along with your registration form serves as your first payment. The three bills will arrive in the middle of the fall semester, and at the beginning and middle of the spring semester. Students whose accounts with outstanding balances after May 1 will NOT be permitted to register for summer lessons or the next academic year until the balance is paid in full.

**Bank Card (debit or credit)**: These payments are processed through Meredith Accounting. Information for paying by credit card arrives by mail with your first bill. After an initial deposit is processed and a Meredith ID is assigned, it is possible to make online payments by contacting the Accounting Department at 919-760-8363. The information is also included on the registration form if the students' Meredith Id is known. New students will be given a Meredith Id after their initial registration form and payment are processed by the CSOM Administrative Assistant.

# **CSOM POLICIES**

### WITHDRAWALS

Students new to our program may withdraw during the first two weeks of the semester, with their fees prorated. *After that, students are responsible for the full semester's fee.* Students who are unable to continue at the end of the fall semester may withdraw in, or before, December with no financial penalty regarding spring charges. Please note that *notification for withdrawal for the spring semester must occur before December 7* as long as the account balance is paid in full. The Music Department must receive notice of withdrawal in writing or by emailing the CSOM Administrative Assistant, June Cassell, at communityschoolofmusic@meredith.edu.

### ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are expected to attend lessons and classes at the time scheduled. **Please do not come to lessons if you are ill**. The full calendar makes it impossible for us to make up missed lessons, group lessons or classes. **If a teacher must miss a lesson**, she/he will notify students in advance, if possible. Teachers will arrange to make up any lessons missed because of the teacher's schedule.

## **INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY**

All lessons are canceled if Meredith College is closed due to inclement weather. Call our Weather Line at (919) 832-8878, on 101.5 FM radio and on WRAL television to hear weather announcements. The closing of public schools does *not* necessarily mean cancellation of lessons. Teachers have varying policies; it is their responsibility to inform students of their policies in the event of school closings. Make-up lessons normally occur at the end of the semester, at times arranged between student and teacher. If a student misses a make-up lesson, that lesson will be forfeited and will not be rescheduled or refunded.



# PARKING

Parking tags **will be required** to attend lessons and classes. New and returning students must acquire new parking permits each year. To avoid parking tickets, please follow these directions carefully. Each registered student/student family can register up to two (2) cars and receive parking tags free of charge. **These parking tags will be issued through the Music Department.** To obtain a parking tag please fill out the parking registration form online when you register. Your teacher will give you your passes when they are available.

Parking for CSOM students with parking tags is required at all times in the <u>visitor spaces</u> in Lot 17. Lot 14 is available for students with parking tags at all times of the day or evening. Lot 16 is available for CSOM students with parking tags after 4:00 pm.

If CSOM families park in Faculty, Staff or Student parking spaces other than Lot 14 and Lot 16 (after 4:00 pm), Campus Police will issue parking tickets. At no time should the circular drive at the main entrance into Wainwright Hall be used to drop off or pick up students. This is a fire lane designated for emergency vehicles only. Please park and enter the building to drop off or pick up students in one of the designated lots. For the increased safety of everyone, we will appreciate your help in following these instructions.
